WHAT IS OPEN IN LOS ANGELES?

Through our Safer at Home efforts, we've collectively slowed the spread of Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) in Los Angeles, allowing for a phased reopening of some businesses and public spaces. However, COVID-19 remains a serious risk. Please continue to practice social (physical) distancing and wear a face-covering whenever you leave your home, and to wash your hands frequently. Also, remember to stay home if you are sick or if you have been in close contact with someone who is sick. **The following are examples of public sites that are open and temporarily closed under the *Reopening Safer at Work and in the Community for Control of COVID-19 Order*.
